### **WELCOME MESSAGE**

Happy New Year! Last year continued to challenge our Network research activities due to COVID-19 restrictions. Despite these restrictions I am extremely pleased to report that our main cohort study, MAGIC, reached a significant milestone. We have recruited over 5,000 subjects of the 8,000 target (62.5%). We are extremely grateful to all the study participants that have enrolled in this study, our research coordinators, and site coordinators that have continued to work in this unprecedented time to keep our research study going. We are reviewing, cleaning and coding our current data so that we are ready to move rapidly for the final analysis when we reach our goal. With this analysis of the cohort data, we hope to uncover ground-breaking findings about the brain-gut connection in persons with IBD and IBS. IMAGINE also submitted its application to the Canadian Institutes of Health Research to secure new funding for Phase 2 of the Network. If successful, this grant will enable us to translate what we've learned from our initial phase of the Network into programs and services for patients with GI disorders. Thank you to all our investigators and patient research partners who worked closely with us to develop our proposal and review our application. We will the learn the results of the application in late March.



We are especially in need of healthy individuals (those without underlying gastrointestinal disease) to join the MAGIC study.


